

Dr. Bryan Choi Mass General for Children Cancer Center

Dr. Choi's research team created dual antigen-targeting tandem CAR T (TanCART) cells to target heterogeneous solid tumors. The team's research shows that this type of therapy can also be manipulated to treat solid tumors like ependymoma.

In April 2023, this research on tandem CAR T-cell therapy for ependymoma has been approved for a Phase I trial.



## Dr. Christopher Recklitis Dana Farber Cancer Institute

Dr. Recklitis's research is focused on understanding the psychological late-effects of cancer, the development of effective screening measures for detecting distress, and the best methods for encouraging health protective behaviors in cancer survivors.

He is the Principal Investigator of Project REACH, a longitudinal study of health outcomes in several hundred locally treated cancer survivors.
